

INSTALLATION GUIDE

Your Greenwall consists of removable and interchangeable plastic trays designed to suit a wide range of plants and local conditions.

A Greenwall transforms bare vertical spaces into walls of lush vegetation. The wellbeing aspect of keeping close to nature is enormous, not only aesthetically but for the planet and your health too!

CHOOSING PLANTS FOR YOUR GREENWALL

Generally, if it grows in a container, it will grow in your Greenwall.

With careful plant choices a living Greenwall can be established anywhere, however you will need to be mindful of where you locate your Greenwall and your choice of plants. Your local nursery or garden shop should be able to offer advice and suggestions.

If you are looking for practical and pretty plants, think about incorporating herbs, as you can always use fresh in the kitchen, or if you want a no-fuss, love-it-and-leave-it option, opt for succulents. Herbs, Natives, Indoor plants, Outdoor plants, Grasses, Bromeliads, the choices are almost endless. Also we suggest to plant something that will trail at the bottom of your Greenwall, and something a bit taller at the top.




INSTALLATION

- I. Once you have chosen the spot for your Greenwall, with the trays removed, measure, mark up and drill 4 holes to fix the panel to the wall, remember to check if it is level.
- 2. If installing multiple panels use the 'C-washer' between overlapping panels see image below.
- 3. If choosing to put your Greenwall inside, ensure it is attached to a firm strong wall and you'll need to ensure to use the correct fixings/screws to properly secure it to your chosen wall. Note fixings or screws are not included, we recommend;
 - for fixing into wood use four M8x50mm galvanised coach screws,
 - for into brick/masonry use four 8x60mm galvanised masonry anchors for each panel,
 - you should use stainless steel screws/anchors if installing the Greenwall close to the sea.
- 4. If using or required, insert tray plugs, then reinsert the base plate. There are plugs included in the pack, insert the plugs before putting soil into the tray, this will inhibit water dripping out of the bottom



- of the trays. We suggest not using plugs outdoors as rain can overfill the tray and water cannot adequately drain.
- 5. Use a good quality potting mix and pack your plants in each tray nice and snug. Place the plants as close to the front of each tray, this will ensure they do not obstruct the tray above.
- 6. Place trays onto the panel by inserting all 6 hooks on the back of the tray onto the panel. For safety push in the Anti-lift arms to safely secure the tray to the panel, release the Anti-lift arms for removing or moving the trays around.
- 7. Give the plants a good watering after planting and keep an eye on them so you know how much water they will need.
